3. Work performance. Preference goes to students who excel in assigned teaching or research and build positive relationships in their assistantship duties.

4. Scholarly citizenship. Preference goes to students who contribute regularly to department intellectual activities and other students' well being.

## **Notes on Tuition and Fee Waivers**

Graduate students receive a tuition and service fee waiver\* only if their assistantships meet the following conditions:

a. The appointment is no less than 25% and no more than 67% time.

b. The student is degree seeking (non-degree students are not eligible).

c. The assistantship appointment runs for at least 91 calendar days (41 during summer term) falling within the time from the week before instruction begins through the last day of final exams.

d. Students must meet and maintain Graduate College registration requirements. Students must register for minimum of 8 hours during fall and spring semester and 3 hours in the summer term. International student are required to register for a greater number of hours if their appointment is less than 50%.

e. Students must remain in good academic standing.

f. Students must have a permanent social security number.

g. Students must successfully meet the requirements of the assistantship.

\* Tuition and service fee waivers do not cover the cost of any tuition differential.
